Glossary

Antigen – any substance that causes the immune system to produce antibodies against it1

Allergen - antigens stimulating hypersensitivity mediated by animmunologic mechanism²

Contact dermatitis – a skin condition in which the skin becomes red, sore, or inflamed after direct contact with a substance. Can be caused by irritants or an allergy³

CD - Celiac disease

DBPCFC – Double-blind, placebo-controlled food challenge

ELISA – enzyme linked immune sorbent assay

FBO – food business operator

FH – food hypersensitivity

FSA – Food Standards Agency

GF - gluten free

ICT – information and communications technology

Ig-E - immunoglobulin E

PAL - precautionary allergen labelling

RCT - randomised control trial

REA – rapid evidence assessment

Occupational allergy – exposure to allergens or chemicals "on the job" that can cause asthma, rhinitis, conjunctivitis, urticaria and contact dermatitis

Urticaria – transient erythematous swelling of the skin, associated with itching, which usually resolves within 24 hours⁴
